# **News Items of Interest**

Mass Timber Buildings: NWOA recently shared this article that reflects the potential value of mass timber construction: 4.5 Acre CLT Production Facility in Oregon As reported in the November Wood Post the KWOA passed a resolution in support of mass timber buildings.

New Regenerative Pilot Program to help American farmers adopt practices that improve soil health, enhance water quality, and boost long-term productivity, all while strengthening America's food and fiber supply. Announced December 10 and administered by USDA's Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS), this new pilot delivers a streamlined, outcome-based conservation model—empowering producers to plan and implement whole-farm regenerative

practices through a single application. Farmers and ranchers interested in regenerative agriculture are encouraged to apply through their local NRCS Service Center by their state's ranking dates for consideration in FY2026 funding. Applications for both EQIP and CSP can now be submitted under the new single regenerative application process. We look forward to learning more specifics in the new year.

KCARD Launches Kentucky AgriLegacy Solutions Program designed to help landowners look at where they are now, where they want to be in the next generation and build a road map for getting there. This program compliments the efforts of the Kentucky Farmland Transition Network, that KWOA is a member of.


